Please let us know what reports have been submitted, any comments resulting from review of these reports, and of site inspections by Ministry staff. The board recognizes the importance of environmental protection, and security for wildlife and humans, at closed mine sites. The board is concerned that these issues do not "fall through the cracks", with the ministry's current focus on increased exploration.
