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## 1. Review of Agenda Items and Motions

1. A motion to approve the agenda was put forward by Ted, seconded by Anne and all voted in favour.
2. A motion to approve the Oct. minutes was put forward by Anne, Seconded by Ted and all voted in favour.

## 2. Guest: Les Ellis

Please refer to the Mar 17th minutes for more detail.

Les is president of the regional cattlemen association. He is expressing concern about Province's lack of consultation with them, with regard to predators.

- He and Anne have discussed the possibility of a workshop.
- Everyone present agreed that far reaching plans for the entire TSA is non applicable to the valley bottom. It needs its own FLP process.

- The Province elected a Cattlemen representative to the FLP Technical Working Group without consulting the Cattlemen associations. The person elected by the Province isn't interested so now the associations can name a representative.
- Anne and Les are working on a letter to Cam Bentley regarding predator control and biodiversity objectives.
- Anne reiterates that we should be citing Kira's report on how extension enhances the knowledge and practice of innovations silviculture in BC. ([cdnsciencepub.com](http://cdnsciencepub.com)) This was referred to last month.

### 3. Guest: Deb Wellwood

Deb gave a background on her career and her work in BC and the Yukon with bear - human conflicts. She refers to a US biologist who has managed these conflicts successfully. He is doing work with wolves and work in Europe too. There are various solutions but sometimes they are intergenerational.

Deb notes - bears aren't randomly located, landscape planning is very local. Les remembers a Meziadin project where sheep were used for silviculture. If a sheep died the requirement was incineration. If bears moved in sheep were moved out.

- A workshop would start with the identification of the hot spots.
- To reiterate what was discussed previously: the CRB is suggesting photo and GPS spatial data collection. There needs to be a map - a spatial representation of what is known or recorded. It's possible the Cattlemen have considered this. We could combine their numbers and knowledge of hot spots with kill verification officers who have worked the area and biologists.
- Forestry is a huge part of this issue.

### 4. Forestry Working Group (FWG) Update

- A. Workshops: format and reporting - Anne/Nick have been talking about this. Nick's concern is that workshops are getting ahead of FLP planning. He proposes Genieve Paterson does the first workshop on the topic of order and structure. Genieve has agreed to facilitate workshops in Smithers.
- B. Some background on reasoning for the workshops was provided. There is no guarantee we will get anything positive out of it.
- C. Anne will ask about a fund for community workshops/facilitators.

\*\*Action Item: Anne is asking for support for mapping from the Province and Wetzinkwa. She wants to ask the Province to officially put these together for posting on our website. We need overlap and neighbouring layers. Common maps that tell a story and are easy to interpret.

## 5. Correspondance

Ron shared some points from a personal letter from Jen Atkins regarding the moratorium on WHMA, GAR, Fish, Wildlife and Lands development, without disclosing most of the contents.

Discussion around this response included:

- new recruits at the Province, they are circled in every 6 months and not familiar
- the old guard are not interested in fixing this
- the Tyhee Mtn Society was told they are about to have an active goshawk, WHMA and one other title on their common ground removed. The Province told them the LRMP is no longer applicable.
- the Provincial branding is much higher.

We need to respond to this....

The thought was that we should reissue our email letter to the board for the letter to the editor. This is deferred until the next meeting.

An Event: protest at 2pm at Tatlow, to protest our forest management.
